Purpose of Kentucky School of Ministry

Kentucky School of Ministry exists to facilitate the mission of the church by promoting and enabling the training of ministers and Christian workers. The School provides training for those sensing a call to ministry, whether as credentialed ministers or as equipped laypersons within the local church. KSOM strives to give doctrinal and practical instruction based upon common core values and shared ministry goals.

Kentucky School of Ministry fully subscribes to the Statement of Fundamental Truths of the Assemblies of God and is committed to proclaim and support the principles and polity of the Assemblies of God. The School is committed to provide training that meets District and General Council educational requirements for ministerial credentials. This training shall be equivalent to criteria adopted by the General Presbytery of the Assemblies of God and complies with the guidelines established by the Association of Assemblies of God District Schools of Ministry.

Statement of Faith

Kentucky School of Ministry fully subscribes to the Statement of Fundamental Truths, as adopted by the General Council of the Assemblies of God, as its statement of faith.

Endorsement

The Kentucky School of Ministry (KSOM) has been recognized and endorsed by the Executive Presbytery of The General Council of the Assemblies of God as a District-based Bible Institute. KSOM is a charter member of the Association of District Schools of Ministry (ADSOM).

The Kentucky School of Ministry has also been recognized and endorsed by the Executive Presbytery of the Kentucky District Council of the Assemblies of God as an official ministerial training program for those seeking credentials through the Kentucky District Council of the Assemblies of God.

Philosophy

Kentucky School of Ministry exists to provide students with a deeper understanding of scripture and ministry principles. KSOM is open to any person, clergy or lay, seeking to enhance his or her ministry to Christ and His church. The School will lead students in a thorough examination of Scripture and provide classroom interaction to develop a broad perspective of understanding the Church's mission and their creative abilities in presenting the gospel. KSOM provides an atmosphere that facilitates spiritual formation, relationship building and academic achievement, fulfilling 2 Timothy 2:15, "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed handling accurately the word of truth" (NIV).

Structure

Classes are conducted at Camp Crestwood (7206 Clore Lane, Crestwood KY, 40014) once a month, nine times a year, one course for each corresponding credential level (Certified Ministry, Licensed Ministry, and Ordained Ministry). Classroom instruction provides an overview of the material, practical applications, and opportunity for questions and discussion. Instructors use a variety of teaching methods, becoming mentors as they share personal ministry experiences and build relationships with their students. KSOM instructors are ordained Assemblies of God ministers, or they are specifically qualified to teach a particular class. Prior to class, each student is required to read the course textbook(s) and complete the course study guide. A minimum of 10 hours of preparatory work is necessary. With the classroom time, students will have invested at least 16 hours per course.

Each weekend class includes six (6) one-hour sessions: two on Friday night, the final exam on Saturday morning and three sessions of value-added teaching following the exam.

Students' study guides must be submitted online no later than midnight (Eastern Time) of the Wednesday immediately prior to the Friday/Saturday class session. All Final Exams are administered online in class. Students must bring their own laptop/mobile device in order to take the Final Exam. KSOM does not have equipment available for student use.

Recognition at NetCon (District Council)

Students who have completed a level of study within the previous year are recognized at our annual Network Conference, and those completing four or more classes through KSOM are distinguished with a KSOM Cord. In addition, those who have received their credentials will be presented with their Credential certificate.

Disclaimer

Credential courses completed through Kentucky School of Ministry meet the educational requirements of the General Council of the Assemblies of God to obtain AG ministry credentials. KSOM courses are only a portion of the credentialing process. Many other aspects enter into the granting of a credential and must be met before a credential will be granted. KSOM provides academic training, not ministerial recognition. Students who desire to pursue AG ministry credentials can find details and instructions to get started at kyag.org/credentialing. Taking classes through Kentucky School of Ministry does not automatically qualify students to receive a credential with the Assemblies of God, nor does participation and completion of the classes give preference in the credentialing process.

Student Policies and Grading Information

- 1. Students must attend all sessions of the weekend to receive credit for the class.
- 2. All online classwork must be completed no later than midnight (Eastern Time) on the Wednesday immediately prior to the Friday/Saturday class session. Students may print a copy of their completed classwork for their reference during the class session at Camp Crestwood.
- 3. An exam will be given over the subject material at the first session on Saturday morning. All final exams are administered online in class. (Students must bring their own laptop/mobile device. KSOM does not have equipment available for student use.)
- 4. All classwork and exams are automatically graded online. Students receive their results immediately upon completion.
- 5. Course grades are determined on the following basis:

- 6. KSOM uses the 10-point grade scale.

A = 90-100%
B = 80-89%
C = 70-79%
D = 60-69%
F = below 60%
- 7. Students must arrive at Camp Crestwood (7206 Clore Lane, Crestwood KY, 40014) between 5:30 and 7:00 pm ET on the Friday evening of class.
- 8. Dormitory lodging at Camp Crestwood is provided for in-person classes. Note: Our facilities do not allow for married couples rooming together. *We can reserve a room for you at a nearby hotel, if prepaid with class registration. Call 502-241-7111 with any questions.

Internships

Students seeking credentials with the Assemblies of God are required by the General Council to complete an internship at each level of study. Students who plan to apply for credentials are encouraged to begin the internship after completing their first class of each level.

The internship enrollment fee is \$25. No additional class sessions or textbooks are required for any of the internships.

The Internship Portfolio, found at kyag.org/ksom, explains the 6 internship components. Students must work with an approved ordained AG minister as their mentor to complete each internship. Exceptions must be approved by the KSOM Director. Mentors must view a video and complete a Mentor Covenant for approval to begin the student's internship.

Educational Requirements for Ministerial Credentials

KSOM provides the biblical and doctrinal education necessary for those seeking ministerial credentials with the Assemblies of God.

College Credit

Classes offered through KSOM are professional and practical training at an institute level. KSOM courses are not for college credit and are not transferable as college credit. However, some Assemblies of God Universities do offer credit for classes taken at AG District Schools of Ministry. Contact the KSOM office for details.

Student Admission and Records

1. Kentucky School of Ministry is open to any person, clergy or lay, seeking to enhance his or her ministry to Christ and His church.
2. KSOM will not deny admission solely based on race, national origin, gender, or physical disability. KSOM may deny admission to any person for any other reason.
3. There is a minimum age of 15 to begin taking KSOM Classes. Minors must be accompanied by a same gender parent/legal guardian when attending KSOM classes. See "Housing for minor KSOM students" on page 9 for details about parental/guardian supervision while at the Crestwood campus.
4. This School is responsible for keeping accurate transcripts and other student records and making them available to the student upon request. A processing fee may apply.

Attendance

Students are required to attend all six class sessions for each KSOM course in their entirety (see page 9 for the schedule of weekend sessions). KSOM is not a correspondence school; attendance is required.

If a student registers for and cannot attend a class, they are to notify the KSOM office at 502-241-7111. If this is done prior to ten days before a class session, moneys paid will be credited to the student's account or refunded.

In the event of an unforeseen emergency such as illness, family crisis (injury or death), or church/ministry crisis (parishioner injury or death occurring immediately prior to or during a KSOM weekend), the student may receive a refund or apply their registration fee to a future class. See page 8 for options to make up a missed class.

Student Code of Ethics, Conduct and Honor

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a Christ-like and Biblical manner at all times, in both their personal conduct and pursuit of their studies, striving to maintain the highest of ethical standards, including honesty and integrity. Failure to adhere to such standards may result in the student's dismissal from KSOM, subject to the decision of the school's administration.

In all class sessions, students should be respectful of their peers and instructors. Behavior that is disruptive to the learning process and disrespectful to others will not be tolerated and will be addressed, first by the instructor of the class, and if necessary, by the administration. Students refusing to be cooperative may be dismissed from the school.

Students are expected to complete the required course assignments of their own effort. While it is reasonable and beneficial for two or more students from the same family, church or community to study together, it is essential that each student's work be his/her own.

How to Enroll in KSOM and Register for Class

STEP 1 – ENROLL IN KSOM

Enroll online at kyag.org/ksom and pay the \$30 enrollment fee. Enrollment is per level of study. Students must re-enroll upon beginning a new level of study, i.e. Certified, Licensed, Ordained.

STEP 2 – REGISTER FOR CLASS

Register online at kyag.org/ksom and pay the \$85 registration fee. Registration for classes must be received prior to 14 days of the offered course. For exceptions, please call the KSOM office, 502-241-7111. Details for exceptions are listed on page 3, "Attendance."

How to Prepare for Class

STEP 1 – PURCHASE TEXTBOOKS

Students are responsible for acquiring the necessary textbook(s) for each class, above the cost of registration. Textbooks for English classes may be purchased at kyag.org/ksom by clicking the "KSOM Books Portal" button. Our book supplier is Christianbook Distributors. Select Kentucky from the "District" list, choose your level of study, and the month of your class. The webpage will show you the textbooks you need. Click "Add to cart" and checkout. Note: Students may purchase their books from any seller. Contact the KSOM office for assistance regarding textbooks.

****French and Spanish classes:** Students purchase their textbooks as they register for class, on the same online form.

STEP 2 – SET UP YOUR ONLINE USER ACCOUNT

English classes require a Moodle user account.

French and Spanish classes require a Berean user account.

Class registration fees include online accounts for all students. The KSOM office will email registered students instructions for setting up their required online accounts. All classwork and exams are completed online. For help with Moodle, "Moodle basics" (PDF) and "Moodle Demo Video" are available on our website, www.kyag.org/ksom.

STEP 3 – COMPLETE THE ONLINE CLASSWORK

Once logged into your student account, students are able to access their required classwork. All online classwork must be submitted no later than midnight (Eastern Time) on the Wednesday immediately prior to the Friday/Saturday class session. **Please note:** Moodle Study Guides automatically submit at 11:59 pm (Eastern) the Wednesday prior to KSOM, whether completed or not.

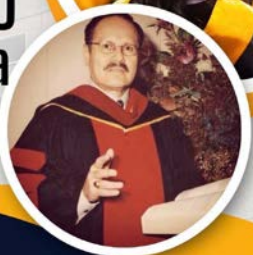

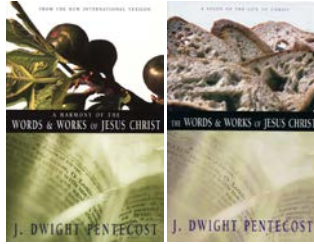

Certified Course Descriptions: Level 1

CER101 Christ in the Synoptic Gospels

This course is a chronological study of the life of Christ. The ministry and events of Jesus' earthly life are examined against the backdrop of the multi-ethnic culture, Jewish history and prophecies, and Jesus' travels during his life.

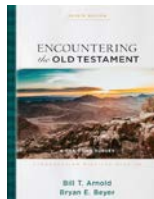

CER102 Old Testament Survey

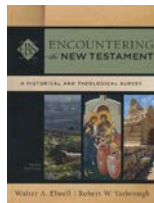

CER103 New Testament Survey

This course provides an in-depth study of the Greek canon. Highlighting facts in each book of the New Testament, students will gain spiritual understanding of the four Gospels and the writings of Paul and the apostles.

CER104 AG History, Missions & Governance

This class walks students through the development of the Assemblies of God, the history of the AG missions movement, and the ecclesiastical governance of the Fellowship. 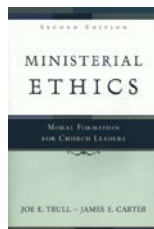

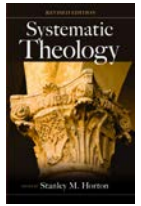

CER106 Introduction to Theology

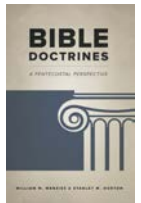

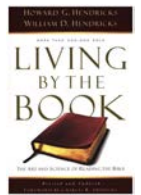

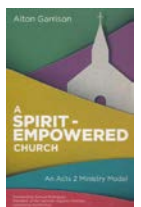

CER109 Beginning Ministerial Internship

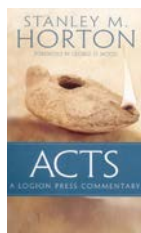

Licensed Course Descriptions: Level 2

LIC201 The Acts of the Holy Spirit

This class provides an extensive study of the book of Acts, with emphasis on the work and role of the Holy Spirit, both in the early Church and today. The growth of the Church is examined from Jerusalem to Rome with an emphasis on the geography and culture, as well as numerical and theological growth.

LIC207 Romans

This course provides a practical study of Paul's letter to the Romans. It deals with the background of the book and its relationship to the rest of the Pauline writings.

This is a practical study of the letters Paul wrote to the churches while in prison. 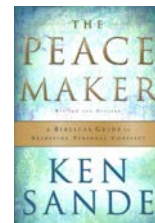

LIC208 Conflict Management

LIC204 Effective Leadership

This practical study examines the management skills a pastor must acquire for successful biblical servant-leadership. LIC210 Intermediate Ministerial Internship

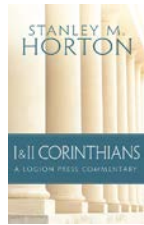


Ordained Course Descriptions: Level 3

ORD301 Corinthian Correspondence

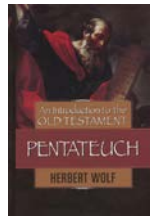

The study examines the Pentateuch's revelation of God's character and the requirements for having a relationship with Him.

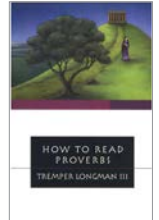

Also studied are the classification of the Psalms, the Messianic Applications and the citations of Psalms in the New Testament and their functions in the Early Church.

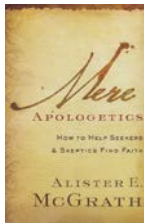
